Rosh Hashanah 9/13 - 9/15

Sunday Night: (1st Night)

- Dvar Torah will be given by Rabbi Rapp between Mincha and Maariv

Monday Morning: (1st Day)

- A half hour Shiur before Davening will be given by Rabbi Rapp
- The Drasha will be given by Rabbi Rapp before Tekias Shofar

Monday Night: (2nd Night)

- A Shiur between Mincha and Maariv will be given by Rabbi Rapp

Tuesday Morning: (2nd Day)

- A half hour Shiur before Davening will be given by Rabbi Rapp
- The Drasha before Tekias Shofar will be given by Rabbi Rapp

Tuesday Night:

- Before Maariv Ted Engel will speak about Israel Bonds and the annual Yom Kippur appeal
 - A Shiur on the Seder Avodah after Davening will be given by Rabbi Rapp

Wednesday Morning:

- A half hour Shiur before Davening will be given by Rabbi Rapp
- The Yizkor Drasha before Yizkor will be given by Rabbi Rapp

Wednesday Afternoon:

- A 30-minute Shiur before Mincha on Yom Kippur-related topic will be given by Rabbi Rapp
- A Dvar Torah before Neilah will be given by Rabbi Rapp
