Kashrus Shorts Edition IV

Am I required to have separate spice containers for meat and dairy? What about separate ketchup bottles?

Halacha Sources:

1. Shulchan Aruch (Y.D. 92:8) discusses the concept of *zeiah* (steam), which has the same status as the food from which the steam originated. Therefore, if one were to shake red pepper flakes directly onto a steaming hot pizza, the steam could cause the shaker to acquire dairy status.
2. Similarly, Shulchan Aruch (Y.D. 88:2) discusses the custom of having separate salt utensils for meat and dairy. This was particularly relevant when salt dishes (as opposed to shakers) were used; particles of meat or dairy would likely accumulate in this dish over time and could cross-contaminate your food.

Practical Applications:

It is recommended to have two separate saltshakers, one designated for meat and one for dairy, for the following reasons:

1. Although we generally use saltshakers, and the salt dish issue is not applicable, the *zeiah* (steam), issue is relevant. If you pour salt directly into a very hot chicken soup, the remaining salt in the shaker can take on a meat status. This would depend on the circumstances, including the temperature and proximity of the saltshaker to the hot food.
2. Additionally, especially in a home with young children, it is not uncommon for a saltshaker to come into direct contact with meat or dairy food. Having separate designated saltshakers eliminates many of these potential concerns.

For the same reason, it is **advisable** to have separate designated bottles of ketchup and other commonly used condiments for meat and dairy. Since these bottles can easily touch the food, using separate bottles helps prevent the transfer of meat and dairy residue from one food to another.
