Rabbi Dr. Tzvi Sinensky is a rabbi, scholar, and educator. He directs the Lamm Legacy, dedicated to preserving the teachings of Rabbi Dr. Norman Lamm, and was an inaugural Sacks Scholar, part of an international program developing Jewish leaders inspired by Rabbi Jonathan Sacks. He received rabbinic ordination and a PhD in Jewish Studies from Yeshiva University and serves as Director of Judaics at Main Line Classical Academy in suburban Philadelphia. He writes and teaches widely, including through his Substack and WhatsApp channel, and is the author of the forthcoming book *Reasonable Judaism*, on how Torah can help us cultivate sound judgment in an increasingly complex age.
